### **24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:**

#### **National Weather Service, 0558 hours, 04/9/16:**

Bands of accumulating snow will bring a few to several inches of accumulation to the northern half of the state along with the Laurel Highlands and lower Susquehanna Valley as a compact but potent area of low pressure at the surface and aloft drifts across southern Pennsylvania today.

Temperatures will start the day in the upper 20s to around 30 across the higher terrain of the north and west with mid to upper 30s across the southeast where some rain will mix in at times with the snow. Very little change in temperature is expected throughout the daylight hours today.

A several hour period of gusty west to northwest winds of 30 to 40 mph will develop this afternoon into early tonight across southern and eastern Pennsylvania as the low reaches the Atlantic Coast and quickly intensifies.


Very cold temperatures are expected tonight as clearing skies and fresh snow cover accompanies high pressure building in from the Ohio Valley. Lows early Sunday in the teens to lower 20s could break records for the date in some locations, especially across the lower Susquehanna Valley where the record low for April 10<sup>th</sup> is only 26 degrees.

A thick shield of clouds will overspread the state from the west by late Sunday morning with a chance for some rain and snow showers across the northwest half of the state during the afternoon hours.

### **WATCHES AND WARNINGS:**

A Freeze Watch is in effect until 1000 on 4/10/2016 for the following counties: Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia.
