**ROAD CLOSURE – Bucks County, 4/10/16** - US 1 is closed in both directions between the Oxford Valley and US 13 Exits in Falls Township due to a fatal motor vehicle accident. An accident reconstruction team has been requested.

**CLOSED:**

**HOSPITAL POWER OUTAGE - Lehigh County, 4/9/16** – The Lehigh Valley Hospital at 2545 Schoenersville Road in Bethlehem City operated on backup power due to a malfunction at PPL's Westgate power substation. It took nearly five hours to have power fully restored.

**24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:**

**National Weather Service, 0556 hours, 04/10/16:**

Very cold conditions for early April will start the day with temperatures in the teens and 20s under clear to partly cloudy skies with just a light breeze as high pressure drifts overhead this morning.

Clouds will thicken in advance of a warm front later this morning and this afternoon. This frontal boundary will bring some light snow or mixed precipitation to the northern mountains later this afternoon and evening with a few rain showers over the rest of the region tonight. Gusty southerly winds of around 30 mph could buffet the higher terrain tonight into Monday.

The high temperature this afternoon will range from the mid-30s across the northern mountains to around 50 degrees in Philadelphia. The low tonight will be in the lower 30s across the northern mountains and mid to upper 30s throughout central and southern Pennsylvania.


A cold front will slide southeast through the Commonwealth late Monday and Monday night, bringing numerous rain showers to all areas of the state. Enough cold air could filter in behind the front in time to end the rain as snow showers Tuesday morning.

Fair weather with gradually moderating temperatures will return for the midweek period.
