National Weather Service, 0440 hours, 04/12/16:

Rain moving across the eastern half of the Commonwealth early this morning will exit the Keystone state around noon. High temperatures will be cooler than yesterday ranging from the low 40s in the northwest to the low 60s in the southeast.


Gradual clearing is expected into tonight with low temperatures in the 20s and 30s. Minimum temperatures near freezing may impact the start of the growing season across portions of southeastern Pennsylvania, with sensitive vegetation at risk of being damaged or killed.

An extended period of fair and dry weather is forecasted from Wednesday through the upcoming weekend. Temperatures will trend warmer each day with widespread 60s and 70s by early next week.
