**POTENTIAL LANDSLIDE – Blair County, 04/13/16** - The Department of Environmental Protection Headquarters is working on an Emergency Permit request to repair a storm water channel at Logan Town Center strip mall located at 150 Falon Lane in Logan Township. A crack in the slope behind the mall has grown from less than inch to over a foot in two days. The concern is that the rock wall could slide into the shops. Jersey barriers have been positioned as a safety measure to help block a slide. The owner and tenants of the mall have all been notified.

**CLOSED:**

**UNKNOWN ODOR – Delaware County, 04/13/16** - Local EMS and fire were dispatched to Scott International Plaza located at 2 Scott Way, Tinicum Township, for a report of an unknown odor making people sick. The building was evacuated. EMS Command declared a mass casualty incident. 27 patients were transported to local hospitals. It was later found that a faulty heater was to blame for the carbon monoxide leak in the building.

**SCHOOL INCIDENT – Philadelphia County, 4/13/16** - A fight between two 8<sup>th</sup> grade students occurred at the Jay Cooke Elementary School, 1300 West Loudon Street, in the City of Philadelphia around 9:00 a.m. this morning. The school hosts children from Kindergarten through Eighth Grade. One student was stabbed in the arm and shoulder. Philadelphia police and EMS units were called to the school and it was locked down for approximately one hour. The victim is in stable condition and another person is in custody.

**POLICE OFFICER DEATH – Butler County, 4/13/16** – The Officer in Charge of the Buffalo Township Police Department suffered a heart attack on duty. EMS was called to the scene and transported the officer to Butler Memorial Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

**SCHOOL LOCKDOWN – Allegheny County, 4/13/16** – Pittsburgh Public School Langley, 2940 Sheraden Boulevard, was placed on lockdown yesterday afternoon due to shots being fired near the school in the City of Pittsburgh. There were no reported injuries to the students or staff. After local police secured the area, the lockdown was lifted.

**SUSPICIOUS PACKAGE – Allegheny County, 4/13/16** – Social media reported that a suspicious package was found on the University of Pittsburgh Campus, outside Posvar Hall, Roberto Clemente Drive, in the City of Pittsburgh. The university sent students an alert, via phone and e-mail, asking them to avoid the area near Schenley Drive. An unknown number of people were evacuated from the building. University police responded to the scene and gave the all clear at 1949.

**UNMANNED DRIFTING BALLOON – Allegheny County, 4/13/16** – A 20'X10' unmanned advertising balloon broke loose from its location at the Aquinas Academy, 2308 West Hardies Road, in Hampton Township. It is unknown if there is a section of tether attached. Its last known altitude was 10,000' and the last known location was over the North Park area of the county.

### National Weather Service, 0410 hours, 04/14/16:


High pressure centered over southeastern Canada early this morning will maintain fair weather across the Keystone State into the weekend. A slight warming trend will prevail into early next week. Winds will remain on the light side.

Aside from a few clouds early on, skies were clear across the Keystone State overnight. Early morning temperatures will be mainly in the 30s.

High temperatures today and Friday will be mostly in the 50s. Lows tonight will be in the 30s throughout the state and in the 20s across the northern tier.
