PUBLIC SAFETY PHONE ISSUES – Indiana County, 4/15/16 – The Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP) has been experiencing a phone outage since 4/14/16 that is impacting some facilities on main campus, Punxsutawney and the North Pointe campuses. Impacted facilities include the Department of Public Safety, only the main line remains available for police. Fire and burglar alarms will activate but not ring into the alarm panels and no contact can be made with the police auxiliary extensions. Verizon has technicians working on repairing a cut telephone line.

National Weather Service, 0424 hours, 04/17/16:


A sprawling area of high pressure will dominate the weather into the beginning of the work week providing sunny mild days and clear cool nights.
