9-1-1 TELEPHONE OUTAGE - Clarion and Armstrong Counties, 5/3/16 - Windstream customers of the 275 telephone exchange in New Bethlehem Borough, Clarion County and Mahoning Township in northern Armstrong County are unable to reach 9-1-1. One critical care facility is affected in Clarion County; Edgewood Heights Personal Care Home. There are no critical care facilities affected in Armstrong County. Clarion County sent an EAS advising residents to reach out to their local fire departments or use a cell phone for emergencies. Both counties report service restored, they are continuing to monitor.

GAS WELL EXPLOSION - Westmoreland County, 4/29/16 - A gas well explosion occurred on State Route 22 in the area of State Route 819 in Salem Township destroying one house and damaging three other homes. One person was transported for injuries caused by the explosion. The pipeline was one of four parallel lines running through the area. Spectra Energy conducted a controlled release of gas from the other lines at the Delmont Compressor Station. Evacuated personnel have returned to their homes. DEP is monitoring the air and plans to test surface water in the area. As of 5/7/16, State Route 819 remains closed between Beaver Run Road and Route 22. The investigation is still ongoing.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

The President's action makes federal funding available to Commonwealth and local governments and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the severe winter storm in Adams, Bedford, Berks, Blair, Bucks, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Fayette, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Montgomery, Northampton, Perry, Philadelphia, Schuylkill, Somerset, Westmoreland, and York counties.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0510 hours, 05/07/16:

Low pressure over the Chesapeake Bay will slide off the east coast today while a cold front approaches from the northwest.

Light showers will fall over much of the state early this morning. As the low pressure moves away, the showers should dry up and some sunshine is expected in the western half of the

state. High temperatures will be into the 60s for most locations with lower 70s possible on the Ohio border.

The cold front will move into the west late this afternoon and early this evening. Showers and a few thunderstorms will accompany the passage of the front. The showers will be most numerous over the west and north this evening and early tonight. Very few of the showers will make it into the southeast. The low temperature tonight will range from the upper 30s in the northern mountains to the upper 40s in the south.

Sunday looks like a breezy and cooler than normal day. Isolated showers will be found along the northern tier. The west wind will occasionally gust into the 25 to 35 mph range over the mountains and the southeast. Highs will be about 5 to 10 degrees below normal. Highs will run between the mid to upper 50s in the north and 70 degrees in the lower Delaware Valley.
