MISSING PERSON – Elk County, 5/28/16 – A search is being conducted for a male in his 40s who was hiking in the Quehanna Wild Area of Jay Township. The missing hiker advised friends by phone that he was having issues with the heat and humidity. Local fire have turned the search over to Department of Conservation & Natural Resources with Cameron County Mountaineer Search and Rescue providing assistance.

MISSING PERSON – Monroe County, 5/28/16 – A search is being conducted for a 56 year old male was reported missing by his family. The subject is a diabetic. His truck was located on Coolbaugh Road in Coolbaugh Township. Local police, fire and Northeast Search & Rescue searched for several hours until suspending operations at sunset. Operations will resume this morning at 0800 hours.

SCHOOL BOMB THREATS – Statewide, 5/23/16 - There was a large number of school bomb threats made across the Commonwealth on Monday 5/23/16. Allegheny County reported three separate threats. Other schools that received a threat, one each in Luzerne, Chester, Erie, and Adams Counties were reported. A NOC Media report stated that there were a large number of school bomb threats across the northeastern states. The NOC Media reported at least ten schools across New England also received automated phone threats on Monday morning. A second round of automated bomb threats targeted schools nationwide on Wednesday.

CLOSED:

WATER SEARCH – Warren County, 5/28/16 – A water search was conducted for a 13 year old male who went swimming at a boat launch in the area of 30 S. Main Street on Minister Creek in Sheffield Township. After approximately three hours of searching, the youth's body was recovered.

LOST CAMPER – Warren County, 5/28/16 – A search was conducted for a lost camper off Austin Hill Road in Cherry Grove Township. After approximately three hours the lost camper was located in good condition.

ROAD CLOSURE – Dauphin County, 5/28/16 - A motorcycle accident closed US Route 22/322 eastbound in Susquehanna Township. One injury was reported. The roadway was closed approximately three hours for accident cleanup and reconstruction.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

The President's action makes federal funding available to Commonwealth and local governments and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the severe winter storm in Adams, Bedford, Berks, Blair, Bucks, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Fayette, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Montgomery, Northampton, Perry, Philadelphia, Schuylkill, Somerset, Westmoreland, and York counties.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0540 hours, 05/29/16:

Low pressure approaching from the Midwest will spread with increasing clouds across Pennsylvania today, along with the chance of an afternoon shower or thunderstorm, especially across the western and northern parts of the state. Highs will range from the upper 70s over the Laurel Highlands, to near 90 over the southeast counties.

The focus of showers and thunderstorms will shift from northwest to southeast across Pennsylvania tonight, as a weak cold front moves through the area. The showers will likely be hit or miss across most of the state. However, a period of steadier and heavier rain is expected over southeast Pennsylvania, where over an inch of rain is likely tonight. Lows tonight will be in the 60s.

The steadiest rain should exit eastern Pennsylvania early Monday. However, a pop up shower or thunderstorm will remain possible Monday afternoon over central and eastern Pennsylvania. Highs for this Memorial Day should range from the upper 70s to low 80s.


