CLOSED:

SCHOOL BOMB THREATS – Statewide, 5/23/16 - There were a large number of school bomb threats made across the Commonwealth on Monday, 5/23/16. Allegheny County reported three separate threats. Other schools that received a threat, one each in Luzerne, Chester, Erie, and Adams Counties were reported. A NOC Media report stated that there were a large number of school bomb threats across the northeastern states. The NOC Media reported at least ten schools across New England also received automated phone threats on Monday morning. A second round of automated bomb threats targeted schools nationwide last Wednesday.

MISSING PERSON – Monroe County, 5/28/16 – A search was conducted for a 56 year old male who was reported missing by his family. The subject is a diabetic. His truck was located on Coolbaugh Road in Coolbaugh Township. The subject was not located and the search has been called off.

TRAIN DERAILMENT - Dauphin County, 5/31/16 - Several empty Norfolk Southern (NS) rail cars derailed in an area just to the east of the Harrisburg Amtrak Terminal in Harrisburg City. This affected both NS freight and Amtrak passenger traffic. There were no hazmat or environmental concerns. The cars were cleared and the line was reopened after approximately eight hours and 40 minutes.

PHONE OUTAGE – Sullivan County, 5/31/16 – Frontier Communications suffered a wide phone outage lasting over nine hours and affecting approximately 2,900 customers in Bradford and Sullivan Counties due to a lightning strike. 911 service was limited to cell phones for the affected customers. Sullivan county 911's administrative lines were also down. The following state agencies were also affected: PSP, DOT, EPA and DCNR.

SCHOOL BUS ACCIDENT - Erie County, 5/31/16 - A Wattsburg School District bus was in an accident at 10770 Wattsburg Road in Greene Township. A total of six students were transported to area hospitals.

SCHOOL BUS ACCIDENT w/ INJURIES - Greene County, 5/31/16 - Two school buses carrying students from the Southeastern Greene School were involved in a rear-end type accident at 931 Mapletown Road in Monongahela Township. Five students were transported to area hospitals.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

The President's action makes federal funding available to Commonwealth and local governments and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the severe winter storm in Adams, Bedford, Berks, Blair, Bucks, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Fayette, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Montgomery, Northampton, Perry, Philadelphia, Schuylkill, Somerset, Westmoreland, and York counties.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0541 hours, 06/01/16:

High pressure centered over eastern Canada will ridge south into Pennsylvania today bringing a mostly sunny sky with quite warm temperatures. Increasing moisture will flow northward into the Commonwealth for Thursday and Friday helping to generate a several hour round of showers and scattered thunderstorms ahead of a relatively weak cold front.

The showers will become likely over western Pennsylvania early Thursday and spread across the central third of the state Thursday afternoon and evening reaching eastern Pennsylvania Thursday night.

Drier conditions will spread back into the state for Friday afternoon and Saturday.

The high temperature this afternoon will be mainly in the lower to mid 80s. The low tonight will range from the upper 50s across the northern and eastern portion of the state to the mid and upper 60s in the western lowlands.
