OPEN:

FLOODING – Clearfield County, 6/2/16 – Clearfield County received over four inches of rain in a short period of time resulting in multiple road closures and heavy localized

flooding. Twenty residents were assisted in moving to a shelter at Trinity Church in Clearfield Borough. These residents were later placed in motels by the Red Cross. All shelters have since been closed. Clearfield County has issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County. PEMA Western Area reported nine homes received water damage on the first floor of their homes. All remaining homes had basement flooding.

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.
