**OPEN:**

**SEVERE WEATHER – Warren County, 6/5/16** – A confirmed EF-1 tornado hit Glade and Conewango Townships. The tornado moved through North Warren from west to east moving

across Route 62, State Street, Conewango Creek and Conewango Avenue. Its path was .8 miles long and about 120 yards wide taking down a large swath of about 100 trees and impacting about a dozen properties. The tornado also knocked down power lines and poles causing power outages for Penelec customers. The North Warren Fire Department set up a shelter with the Red Cross for 100 to 200 people affected by the storm. Warren County EMA is conducting damage assessments.

### **CLOSED:**

**VEHICLE ACCIDENT – Northampton County, 6/7/16** – A multi-vehicle accident involving two tractor trailers and a school bus occurred on Interstate 78 westbound at mile marker 71.1 in Lower Saucon Township. The school bus had 37 students from Wayne Valley High School in New Jersey. Five students were transported to the local hospital for minor injuries. One tractor trailer was a Fed Ex truck and the other was a tanker hauling 3,500 gallons of bis (2-ethylhexyl) terephthalate. Rapid Response responded to offload the product.

**NATURAL GAS LEAK - York County, 6/7/16** – An excavator struck and ruptured a two inch natural gas line on Sutton Road in York Township. Fire units arrived on scene and had residents in the immediate area shelter in place. Columbia Gas was notified and the line was secured after approximately three hours.

### **DISASTER DECLARATIONS:**

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

### **24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:**

#### **National Weather Service, 0535 hours, 06/08/16:**

Post frontal showers are moving through central Pennsylvania this morning. These showers will continue to move eastward through the morning hours. As showers move eastward by early afternoon cold northwesterly flow will filter into Pennsylvania. This flow will bring cool gusty winds with cloudy skies over the western half of the state today as the cool air flows over the Great Lakes. Central and eastern Pennsylvania will begin to clear as the afternoon and evening progresses.

High temperatures by Wednesday afternoon will range from the 50s over the northwest mountains to the upper 60s over the southeast. Lows tonight will vary from the low 40s
