**CLOSED:**

**ROAD CLOSURE – Berks County, 6/13/16** – A dump truck crossed the median and struck 5 to 6 other vehicles closing US Route 422 westbound at the Interstate 76 exit in the City of Reading. There was a 50 gallon diesel fuel leak with up to 20 gallons of fuel going into a nearby storm drain. Three patients were transported to Reading Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The roadway was closed approximately four hours for accident clean up.

**DISASTER DECLARATIONS:**

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

**National Weather Service, 0426 hours, 06/14/16:**

Expect a mix of clouds and sun across Pennsylvania today with high temperatures ranging from the low 70s in the Alleghenies to around 80 degrees near the Mason-Dixon Line. The risk for showers and thunderstorms will increase through midweek with a few strong to severe storms possible over the southwest third of the Keystone State on Thursday afternoon and evening.
