COMMERCIAL STRUCTURE FIRE – Northampton County, 6/14/16 – A commercial structure fire alarm was reported at Frank’s Pizza, 3926 Nazareth Pike in Bethlehem Township. Upon fire departments arrival, they reported an odor of something burning at Tiger Schulmann’s Mixed Martial Arts. The entire complex of approximately twelve stores, including a Walmart, were evacuated. An elderly female sustained an injury from a fall while leaving Walmart. Upon inspection, nothing was found and all units cleared the scene.

ROAD CLOSURE – Westmoreland County, 6/14/16 – US Route 22 in Salem Township was closed for over six hours due to a traffic accident involving a tractor trailer and approximately seven passenger vehicles. There were reports of entrapment and a possible vehicle fire. One patient was flown to UPMC Presbyterian.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.
