ROAD CLOSURE - Philadelphia County, 6/15/16 - A tractor trailer fire closed Interstate 95 north at mile marker 23 in the city of Philadelphia for approximately four hours. Traffic was being diverted onto Interstate 676 west.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0522 hours, 06/16/16:

A pair of low pressure systems will track southeast across Pennsylvania today, bringing a chance of showers early this morning across eastern Pennsylvania and the likelihood of thunderstorms across the western and central counties this afternoon and evening. High temperatures today will range from the low 70s over the Pocono Mountains, to the low 80s across the southwest counties. Lows tonight will range from the upper 50s to mid-60s.

A few showers will linger across southern Pennsylvania through Friday morning, then breaking clouds are expected as the low exits the coast and high pressure builds in from the Great Lakes. Highs Friday will range from 75 to 80 over most of the state.
