MISSING PERSON – Chester County, 06/17/16 - A search was in progress for an 86 year old male with dementia and cardiac disease who wandered away from his residence on the 200 block of Steeplechase Drive in West Whiteland Township. Police with K9 units, fire personnel and a Philadelphia Police helicopter were assisting in the search. The search was suspended after several hours and will resume in the daylight hours.

CLOSED:

AIRCRAFT CRASH – Centre County, 06/16/16 - A Piper Navajo Aircraft crashed into a wooded area approximately one mile east of the University Park Airport (UNV) in Benner Township. It was a private plane with two passengers on board. There were no survivors. The flight originated in Washington County and was inbound to UNV. Civil Air Patrol and State Police provided security at the scene. Centre County EMA, FAA, and NTSB were on scene and conducted their investigations on 6/17/16.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.
