SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

OPEN:

TRAIN DERAILMENT - Luzerne County, 6/19/16 - Norfolk Southern reported that at approximately 1430 hours, 21 cars derailed along the Laurel Run line at mile post 159-160 in Laurel Run Borough. The track is owned by the Reading Blue Mountain and Northern Railroads. All cars remained upright and there are no spills of hazardous materials. The derailed cars include seven loaded LPG cars, one residual LPG car, and one residual sulfur car. Norfolk Southern will be able to reroute traffic around the area, there is no impact to the Reading Blue Mountain & Northern Railroad Companies traffic at this time. The rail company has come up with a plan and is working on it. There is no estimate at this time of when work will be completed.

CLOSED:

EMERGENCY BRIDGE REPAIR - Bedford County, 6/20/16 - The Pennsylvania Turnpike, Interstate 76 westbound was closed from the Breezewood Exit #161 to the New Stanton Exit #75, for emergency bridge work at mile marker 130 in Juniata Township. This was needed to facilitate a repair of a hole that developed in the bridge deck that carried the Turnpike over New Baltimore Road (SR 3012). The Plan X was in effect between the exits till approximately 0100 hours for the cement to properly cure.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 - The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0602 hours, 06/21/16:

Residual showers with a few isolated thunderstorms will continue to move through the southern and eastern regions of Pennsylvania this morning and early afternoon. These showers and storms are associated with a passing cold front that will pass through Pennsylvania today.

Due to the cold front high temperatures will be lower than the last few days, however they will still range from the mid 70s in the northwest to the upper 80s along the Mason Dixon Line. Lows tonight will be in the low 50s throughout the northern half of Pennsylvania and in the upper 50s to low 60s through southern Pennsylvania.
