SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

OPEN:

TRAIN DERAILMENT - Luzerne County, 6/19/16 – A 21 car train derailment occurred on the Laurel Run Line at mile post 159-160 in Laurel Run Borough. The track is owned by Reading Blue Mountain and Northern Railroads. All cars were upright and there were no hazardous materials spilled. The derailed cars include seven loaded LPG cars, one residual LPG car, and one residual sulfur car. The cars have all been rerailed. Traffic is being rerouted around the area while work continues on repairing the tracks.

CLOSED:

RIVER RESCUE – Somerset County, 6/21/16 – Multiple emergency crews conducted a river search for a female who fell or jumped from the McNally Bridge into the Stonycreek River, Conemaugh Township. Her body was recovered and turned over to the coroner.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0543 hours, 06/22/16:

Fair weather will prevail in Pennsylvania through most of today.

A low pressure center moving east from the mid-Mississippi Valley will return the chance of showers and thunderstorms to the state tonight into Thursday. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are possible with heavy rainfall possible overnight tonight mainly through the southwest corner of the state. Fair weather will follow for the weekend.

The high temperature today will vary from the mid 70s in the Alleghenies to the mid 80s in the lower Delaware Valley. Lows tonight will range from the mid 50s in the north to the upper 60s throughout the southern half of Pennsylvania.
