**TRAIN DERAILMENT - Luzerne County, 6/19/16** – A 21 car train derailment occurred on the Laurel Run Line at mile post 159-160 in Laurel Run Borough. The track is owned by Reading Blue Mountain and Northern Railroads. All cars were upright and there were no hazardous materials spilled. The derailed cars include seven loaded LPG cars, one residual LPG car, and one residual sulfur car. The cars have all been re-railed. Rail traffic is being rerouted around the area. The work continues on repairing the tracks.

**CLOSED:**

**ROAD CLOSURE – Chester County, 6/23/16** – US 322 was closed in both directions between SR 3100 and Phoenixville Pike in West Goshen Township due to a large tree falling across the roadway. The roadway was closed for five and one half hours.

**DISASTER DECLARATIONS:**

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

**24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:**

**National Weather Service, 0438 hours, 06/24/16:**

A stationary front just south of the Maryland border will bring variable amounts of cloudiness and a chance for a few showers or thunderstorms to southern areas today while the northern part of the state will remain mainly dry. High temperatures will range from around 70 degrees in the Laurel Highlands to the low 80s across eastern Pennsylvania.
