DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

National Weather Service, 0400 hours, 06/27/16:

A frontal system will bring scattered showers and thunderstorms to the region today and tomorrow.

An approaching cold front will bring a round of showers and thunderstorms to the Commonwealth today. It will be more humid with highs generally in the low to mid 80s.

Tonight will be variably cloudy with a few lingering showers, especially over eastern areas of the state. Lows will drop back into the 60s.

Tuesday will see a mix of sun and clouds with a shower or thunderstorm possible in spots. The best chance for rain will be over the eastern part of the state. Highs will vary from the mid 70s near the shores of Lake Erie to the mid 80s near Philadelphia.
