SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

OPEN:

LANDSLIDE – Allegheny County, 6/28/16 - West Carson Street is closed between Commerce Street to the West End Circle in the City of Pittsburgh. Two large boulders have been removed from the roadway. The street will remain closed due to possible instability of the hillside. A Norfolk Southern main rail line is shut down for freight trains. No passenger trains travel this route. Clean-up efforts are still in progress.

CLOSED:

ROAD CLOSURE – Monroe, 6/30/16 – A vehicle accident closed all southbound lanes of State Route 209 at Schafers Schoolhouse Road in Monroe Township. Two injuries were reported. Southbound traffic was detoured onto Business Route 209 and then back onto State Route 209.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0411 hours, 06/30/16:

High pressure over the Upper Ohio Valley today will maintain fair weather in Pennsylvania today. A cold front should push through the Commonwealth late Friday and help to generate some showers and thunderstorms, mainly in the east and northwest. Fair weather will then prevail over the Independence Day weekend as another high pressure area slides in from central Canada.

The high temperature today will vary from the mid to upper 70s in the west to the mid 80s in the southeast. Lows tonight will be near 50 degrees near Bradford and Coudersport, but in the upper 60s in Philadelphia. Highs on Friday will be in the mid 70s in the west and mid 80s in the southeast.
