LANDSLIDE – Allegheny County, 6/28/16 - West Carson Street is closed between Commerce Street to the West End Circle in the City of Pittsburgh. Two large boulders have been removed from the roadway. The street will remain closed due to possible instability of the hillside. A Norfolk Southern main rail line is shut down for freight trains. No passenger trains travel this route. Clean-up efforts are still in progress.

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:


National Weather Service, 0523 hours, 07/1/16:

A cold front will push southeast from the Great Lakes today, bringing an increasing chance of showers and thunderstorms across Pennsylvania. The best chance of thunderstorms will be this afternoon across the eastern half of the state. High temperatures today will range from the low 70s across the northwest mountains, to the mid-80s across the southeast piedmont.

Any remaining showers or thunderstorms will end from west to east this evening with the passage of the front. High pressure will build in Saturday and Sunday, supplying fair weather and near average temperatures. A warm front approaching from the Ohio Valley could potentially threaten southern Pennsylvania with rain for the 4th of July.
