**OPEN:**

**LANDSLIDE – Allegheny County, 6/28/16** - West Carson Street is closed between Commerce Street to the West End Circle in the City of Pittsburgh. Two large boulders have been removed from the roadway. The street will remain closed due to possible instability of the hillside. A Norfolk Southern main rail line is shut down for freight trains. No passenger trains travel this route. Clean-up efforts are still in progress. The road is not expected to reopen until July 6, 2016 at the earliest.

**CLOSED:**

**MISSING PERSON - Northampton County, 7/2/16** – A search was conducted for a 22 year old female who was reported missing from her residence in Nazareth Borough. She was reported to be intoxicated and suicidal. She was located after fourteen hours at a nearby hospital where she will stay for observation.

**DISASTER DECLARATIONS:**

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

**National Weather Service, 0605 hours, 07/03/16:**

High pressure over Pennsylvania will provide the state with fair and seasonable weather today. There will likely be a fair amount of high clouds across the southern half of the state, while mostly sunny skies are expected over the northern tier. Highs today will range from the low 70s over the Laurel Highlands, to the low 80s in the valleys of eastern Pennsylvania.
