SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

OPEN:

LANDSLIDE – Allegheny County, 6/28/16 - West Carson Street is closed between Commerce Street to the West End Circle in the City of Pittsburgh. Two large boulders have been removed from the roadway. The street will remain closed due to possible instability of the hillside. A Norfolk Southern main rail line is shut down for freight trains. No passenger trains travel this route. Clean-up efforts are still in progress. The road is not expected to reopen until July 6, 2016 at the earliest.

CLOSED:

ROAD CLOSURE – Clarion County, 7/3/16 – An accident involving two vehicles closed Interstate 80 eastbound at mile marker 69 in Clarion Township. A detour was established for eastbound traffic using exit 64 (State Route 66). Several injured were reported and transported to area hospitals.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0550 hours, 07/04/16:

Low pressure approaching from the Mississippi Valley will bring an increasing chance of showers today across southern Pennsylvania and increasing cloudiness across the north. Highs will range from the upper 60s over the Laurel Highlands, to the low 80s across the northeast part of the state.

Showers will continue to fall over primarily the southern half of the state tonight, as the low pressure system moves through. Lows temperatures will be in the 60s.


