6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

**24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:**

**National Weather Service, 0532 hours, 07/08/16:**

A cluster of showers and thunderstorms continues to move along Lake Erie early this morning. Patchy fog over the central mountains will continue through the first half of the morning. As the system that is generating the showers and thunderstorms moves through the southern Great lakes region, it will slowly move along the New York and Pennsylvania border early this afternoon. Expect for a line of showers and thunderstorms to form this afternoon, intensifying as it reaches and moves through Eastern Pennsylvania late this afternoon and through early evening. The region will see a more active weather pattern over the next few days as an upper level low slowly moves eastward through Sunday. The system will finally bring a cold front through tomorrow night which should bring cooler and drier weather to the area Sunday.

High temperatures today will range from the low 80s through the Northwest to the low to mid 90s through the Southeast. Lows tonight will vary from the low 60s along the New York border to the low 70s along the Mason Dixon.
