CLOSED:

SINK HOLE / EVACUATION – Allegheny County, 7/9/16 – A large sink hole developed near Summit Apartments on North Chestnut Street in Avalon Borough. The incident occurred when a dump truck pulled into a parking area and the surface beneath it gave way due to the partial collapse of an underground parking garage. The Salvation Army responded to assist approximately 60 residents that were evacuated from the apartments to the borough hall. The residents were allowed to return to their homes after approximately eight hours.

ROPE RESCUE – Lackawanna County, 7/9/16 – A 15 year old female fell down a 100 foot well near a dry dam on Drinker Turnpike in Covington Township. Emergency responders rescued her from the well after several hours. She was transported to the local hospital, along with two fire fighters and one police officer, for hypothermia.

COMMERCIAL STRUCTURE FIRE – Washington County, 7/9/16 – A three alarm fire occurred at National Polymers, a SARA Facility, in Speers Borough. The county hazmat team responded for chemicals on fire inside. During firefighting operations, paint additives mixed with fire hose water which created a run off. No waterways or drains were affected. The water was tested and showed a visual light cloudiness, but no chemical reading. The company will contact a remediation company on Monday.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0432 hours, 07/10/16:

As the upper level low lifts to the northeast and drags the cold front eastward a ridge will build over the mid Atlantic region over the next few days. Dry northwesterly flow today will keep the region generally precipitation free with only a slight chance of showers through the northeastern corner of Pennsylvania this morning.

Drier air will continue to filter in today with mostly sunny skies. Highs will range from the mid 70s across the northern mountains and the Laurel Highlands to the low to mid 80s across the southeastern Piedmont. Temperatures today should be slightly below normal. Lows tonight will range from the low 50s in the northwest mountains to the low 60s throughout Southern Pennsylvania.
