SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

OPEN:

ROAD CLOSURE – Union County, 7/13/16 – Interstate 80 is closed at mile post 210 in White Deer Township due to a tractor trailer fire. The truck was hauling 20 – 50 gallon drums of an epoxy resin material. The Northridge HazMat Team is on scene. Residue from firefighting efforts has run off into a nearby field and has been contained with trenches.

CLOSED:

POSSIBLE HAND GRENADE – Dauphin County, 7/12/16 – A maintenance worker found a hand grenade in the closet of an apartment at Interfaith Apartments on Mill Street in Middletown Borough. 100 residents were evacuated as a precaution. The State Police Bomb Unit responded and determined the grenade was inert.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0543 hours, 07/13/16:

Warm and muggy conditions are expected in Pennsylvania through Thursday with scattered thunderstorms. Isolated severe thunderstorms with strong winds are possible across northwest Pennsylvania Thursday afternoon and evening.

Dangerous heat conditions are possible Thursday afternoon and evening across southeastern Pennsylvania including the Philadelphia metro area and urban corridor along Interstate 95.

Dry weather is probable across most of the Commonwealth Friday through Sunday with slightly lower humidity levels. Temperatures will average a few to several degrees above climate normals for mid-July.

WATCHES AND WARNINGS:

An excessive heat watch has been issued for Delaware, Eastern Chester, Eastern Montgomery, Lower Bucks and Philadelphia Counties until July 15 at 8:00pm.
