ROAD CLOSURE – Union County, 7/13/16 – Interstate 80 was closed for approximately four hours due to a tractor trailer fire at mile post 210 in White Deer Township. The truck was hauling 20 – 50 gallon drums of an epoxy resin material.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.


24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0521 hours, 07/14/16:

Very warm and humid conditions are expected in Pennsylvania today with high temperatures this afternoon in the mid 80s to low 90s. Isolated to scattered severe thunderstorms with strong damaging winds are possible during the afternoon and evening. Dangerous heat conditions are expected across a portion of southeastern Pennsylvania including the Lehigh and Delaware Valleys and Philadelphia metro area. Dry weather remains probable across most of the Commonwealth Friday through Sunday with more seasonable temperatures and slightly lower humidity.

WATCHES AND WARNINGS:

An excessive heat warning has been issued for Delaware, Eastern Chester, Eastern Montgomery, Lower Bucks and Philadelphia Counties until July 15 at 2000.
