OPEN:

ROAD CLOSURE – Dauphin County, 7/15/16 – Interstate 83 northbound is closed at Exit 44B (19th Street) due to an overturned tractor trailer hauling frozen chicken. The interstate is expected to reopen around 0800.

CLOSED:

911 PHONE OUTAGE – Green County, 7/14/16 – All 911 and business phone lines at Greene County 911 Center were out of service for several hours. The PUC assisted the county with Windstream to correct the problem. The cause of the outage is unknown.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.


A cold front is entering the northwestern part of Pennsylvania this morning. This should start to cool things off and bring much lower humidity to the Commonwealth this weekend; however, heat and humidity will remain elevated today, especially in the south and east.

Isolated showers and thunderstorms are still possible over the State today but mostly across the north and west. Weak showers are possible in the southeast this morning as well. It will be another hot day with temperatures exceeding 90 degrees in most of the eastern valleys. The rest of the state will get into the 80s.

Temperatures will cool off into the 50s across the north as the cooler, drier air works in, but the lows will again be in the 70s in the lower Delaware Valley. Highs on Saturday will be between 5 and 15 degrees lower than today. A few showers are still possible in the afternoon over the north.

WATCHES AND WARNINGS:

An excessive heat warning has been issued for Delaware, Eastern Chester, Eastern Montgomery, Lower Bucks and Philadelphia Counties until July 15 at 2000.
