CHEMICAL FIRE - Lycoming County, 7/18/16 - A fire involving a chemical called EMI-3141 occurred at MI Swaco in the city of Williamsport. There were no injuries or evacuation reported. The facility stores chemicals used in the fracking industry. Chemicals did not spread past the containment area. The company will monitor the scene overnight until the clean-up contractor arrives in the morning.

TRACTOR TRAILER ACCIDENT/HAZMAT - Washington County, 7/17/16 - A vehicle accident involving an overturned tractor trailer closed U.S. Route 22 westbound just prior to the West Virginia State Line in Hanover Township. The trailer was breached and leaked approximately 3,500 gallons of dicyclopentadiene of its approximate 7,000 gallon load. Traffic was diverted off Exit 5 westbound onto State Route 18. Remediation and clean-up was handled by Specialty Professional Services. The spill was contained, and secured with no impact to waterways.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0523 hours, 07/19/16:

High pressure over the Great Lakes will build southeast toward Pennsylvania today and Wednesday, bringing the Commonwealth fair weather and lower humidity the next couple of days.
