OPEN:

MISSING PERSON – Potter County, 7/19/16 – A search started on Sunday for a 78 year old Alzheimer's patient who went missing from her home in Galeton Borough on Friday 7/15/16. K-9 search teams, a State Police helicopter and emergency crews searched yesterday before efforts were suspended overnight to resume this morning. Search efforts

will resume around 0800 hours and include a State Police Cadaver K-9 team and a Civil Air Patrol team of between 10-15 personnel.

STRUCTURE FIRE – Allegheny County, 7/19/16 - An apartment fire occurred at Hilltop Parkview Manor Apartments on Duquesne Place Drive in Duquesne City. The fire started in the kitchen of an apartment before spreading, causing 24 units to be displaced. The Red Cross responded to assist 66 residents including 40 children, displaced from the fire. During firefighting operations, seven firefighters were transported to the hospital for various injuries.

CLOSED:

GAS LINE STRUCK – Allegheny County, 7/19/16 – A PennDOT worker struck a gas line on Yutes Run Road in Springdale Township. The line belonged to a gas well. The gas well company arrived on scene and secured the valve stopping the leak. Local residents were evacuated and assisted by the Salvation Army.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0510 hours, 07/20/16:

High pressure over the eastern Great Lakes will build southeast across Pennsylvania today, providing the state with mostly sunny skies, light wind and low humidity. Highs this afternoon will range from the upper 70s over the higher terrain of the Alleghenies, to the low and mid 80s elsewhere.

Clear and tranquil conditions are expected tonight with low temperatures ranging from the low 50s in the coolest valleys of the north, to the upper 60s in Philadelphia.

As the high pressure system passes off the coast, a warmer southwest flow will develop on Thursday. Under sunny skies, temperatures should reach 85 to 90 degrees across most of the state.
