**STRUCTURE FIRE – Allegheny County, 7/19/16** - An apartment fire occurred at Hilltop Parkview Manor Apartments on Duquesne Place Drive in Duquesne City. The fire started in the kitchen of an apartment before spreading, causing 24 units to be displaced. The Red Cross responded to assist 66 residents including 40 children, displaced from the fire. Norfolk Southern rail traffic in the vicinity of the apartment complex was suspended for three hours and has been restored. During firefighting operations, seven firefighters were transported to the hospital for various injuries. There is an ongoing investigation.

**FIREFIGHTER FATALITY – McKean County, 7/23/16** - A volunteer firefighter fatality resulted from an accident involving a Tanker Truck at the Hilltop Volunteer Fire Company Station, located at 4351 Route 646 in Keating Township.

**CLOSED:**

**WATER MAIN BREAK – Mercer County, 7/22/16** - Aqua Water had a 24" water main break in Sharon and Farrell Cities. Repairs were completed on 7/23/2016. No Boiled Water Advisory was required because the break was repaired and they did not lose any water.

**DISASTER DECLARATIONS:**

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

A heat wave will continue in Pennsylvania for the next several days, The heat and humidity will combine to create dangerous heat index values over the southeastern quarter of the state.


A weak cold front but potent upper level disturbance will move east across the region on Monday accompanied by numerous showers and even some scattered, gusty thunderstorms in the afternoon and evening.

The high temperature this afternoon will vary from the upper 80s across the Allegheny Plateau of northern and western Pennsylvania to the mid 90s in the greater Philadelphia area.

The low temperature tonight will be in the mid to upper 60s across the north to the lower and middle 70s in the south.
