STRUCTURE FIRE – Allegheny County, 7/19/16 - An apartment fire occurred at Hilltop Parkview Manor Apartments on Duquesne Place Drive in Duquesne City. The fire started in the kitchen of an apartment before spreading, causing 24 units to be displaced. The Red Cross responded to assist 66 residents including 40 children, displaced from the fire. Norfolk Southern rail traffic in the vicinity of the apartment complex was suspended for three hours and has been restored. During firefighting operations, seven firefighters were transported to the hospital for various injuries. There is an ongoing investigation.

FIREFIGHTER FATALITY – McKean County, 7/23/16 - A volunteer firefighter fatality occurred from an accident involving a tanker truck at the Hilltop Volunteer Fire Company Station.

CLOSED:

WATER RESCUE – Erie County, 7/25/16 – A 38 year old male went missing in French Creek in LeBoeuf Township. The subject was located approximately five hours later deceased. The coroner was called out to the scene.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0544 hours, 07/25/16:

A few rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur today, along and ahead of a cold front that will push southeast across much of the state by tonight. A few of the storms could contain localized strong or damaging wind gusts and hail.

It will remain very warm in Pennsylvania throughout much of this week, and the heat wave that began in southeastern Pennsylvania last Thursday will continue.

Lingering high humidity and a chance of a shower or thunderstorm will persist across southern Pennsylvania tonight and Tuesday while an area of high pressure brings drier air with more comfortable humidity over the northern half of Pennsylvania.


The daily high temperature in the lower Susquehanna and Delaware Valleys will remain above 90 degrees through Thursday. The heat and humidity will combine to bring the heat index values to dangerous levels over 100 degrees today.
