FIREFIGHTER FATALITY – McKean County, 7/23/16 - A volunteer firefighter fatality occurred due to an accident involving a tanker truck at the Hilltop Volunteer Fire Company Station. Funeral services are scheduled for Thursday, July 28, 2016 at 1300.

CLOSED:

STRUCTURE FIRE – Allegheny County, 7/19/16 - An apartment fire occurred at Hilltop Parkview Manor Apartments on Duquesne Place Drive in Duquesne City. The fire started in the kitchen of an apartment before spreading, causing 24 units to be displaced. The Red Cross responded to assist 66 residents including 40 children, displaced from the fire. Norfolk Southern rail traffic in the vicinity of the apartment complex was suspended for three hours and has been restored. During firefighting operations, seven firefighters were transported to the hospital for various injuries.

HAZARDOUS MATERIAL SPILL – Lebanon County, 7/25/16 - A hazardous material spill of sulfuric acid occurred on Interstate 81 southbound near mile marker 86 in Hanover Township. An estimated 300 gallons of sulfuric acid was spilled out of the two breached totes. Interstate 81 northbound was shut down during the initial response due to a vapor cloud from the sulfuric acid. Interstate 81 southbound was closed for a significant period of time for hazardous material clean up.

ROAD CLOSURE – York County, 7/25/16 - A tractor trailer accident closed Interstate 83 southbound at mile marker 9 in Springfield Township. The tractor trailer went into the median. The road was closed for an extended period of time for clean up operations.

STRUCTURE FIRE – Allegheny County, 7/25/16 - A four alarm structure fire occurred at 2407 Sorrell Street in the City of Pittsburgh. One adult, four children, and two firefighters were transported to the hospital. Two children were pronounced DOA at the hospital.

AIRCRAFT FIRE – Allegheny County, 7/25/16 - A small two seat aircraft caught fire on the runway of the Allegheny County Airport in West Mifflin Borough. The pilot received 70% burns to his face and body. He was transported to UPMC Mercy Hospital in Pittsburgh.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

7/25/2016 - The Commissioners of Lackawanna County have issued a Declaration of Disaster Emergency for Dunmore Borough due to severe weather.

6/2/2016 - The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0451 hours, 07/26/16:

Patchy clouds across the state this morning will break up and leave a mostly sunny sky. Only slightly more clouds are expected in the south versus the north. The humidity will be lower than on Monday, but it will still be summer-like with above normal temperatures. Highs will range from the lower 80s across northwestern Pennsylvania to the mid 90s in the southeast.

Temperatures tonight will dip into the mid 50s in the northern mountains but not get below the mid 70s in Philadelphia. Most of the Commonwealth will see lows in the 60s.

Expect another mostly sunny and very warm day on Wednesday with highs ranging from the mid 80s to the lower 90s.
