FIREFIGHTER FATALITY – McKean County, 7/23/16 - A volunteer firefighter fatality occurred due to an accident involving a tanker truck at the Hilltop Volunteer Fire Company Station. Funeral services are scheduled for Thursday, July 28, 2016 at 1300.

CLOSED:

ROAD CLOSURE – Lancaster County, 7/26/16 – US Route 30 between Hoover Road and Brackbill Road in Salisbury Township was closed for over 14 hours due to a tractor trailer striking a utility pole. The vehicle leaked approximately 100 gallons of diesel fuel and an electrical transformer that was damaged leaked oil. Lancaster County hazmat conducted clean up.

DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

7/25/2016 – The Commissioners of Lackawanna County have issued a Declaration of Disaster Emergency for Dunmore Borough due to severe weather.

7/19/2016 – The U.S. Small Business Administration issued a SBA disaster declaration for Fayette, Greene, Somerset, Washington and Westmoreland counties for damages during the flooding event on June 17, 2016. The effective date is 7/19/16 and termination date for applications is 9/19/16. Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) application termination date is 4/19/17.

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0540 hours, 07/27/16:

A stationary front along the Maryland border will lead to persistent cloud cover and just a few very light showers. The rest of the Commonwealth should be mostly sunny and dry. The humidity will be somewhat uncomfortable in the far south, but it should remain much more comfortable across most of the state. Highs will range from the lower 80s in the Laurel Highlands to the lower 90s in the lower elevations of the southeastern half of the state.

Clouds will increase from the southwest later tonight. A few light showers remain possible in the extreme southeastern counties but, it should remain dry otherwise. Lows tonight will be around 60 in the north-central mountains and near 70 in the south.

The humidity will begin to climb on Thursday. Under partly sunny skies, there will be a few showers and thunderstorms. The showers will be more possible in the southeast and also during the afternoon; however, almost everywhere in the state will have a chance of a shower before the end of the day.
