**FIREFIGHTER FATALITY – McKean County, 7/23/16** - A volunteer firefighter fatality occurred due to an accident involving a tanker truck at the Hilltop Volunteer Fire Company Station. Funeral services are scheduled for Thursday, July 28, 2016 at 1300.

### **CLOSED:**

**MASS CASUALTY ACCIDENT – Lancaster County, 7/27/16** – A vehicle accident occurred at Newport Road (SR 772) and Stumptown Road in Upper Leacock Township. One of the vehicles involved was a small tour bus with mostly elderly passengers. A total of 14 victims were transported to the hospital.

### **DISASTER DECLARATIONS:**

7/25/2016 – The Commissioners of Lackawanna County have issued a Declaration of Disaster Emergency for Dunmore Borough due to severe weather.

7/19/2016 – The U.S. Small Business Administration issued a SBA disaster declaration for Fayette, Greene, Somerset, Washington and Westmoreland counties for damages during the flooding event on June 17, 2016. The effective date is 7/19/16 and termination date for applications is 9/19/16. Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) application termination date is 4/19/17.

6/2/2016 – The Commissioners of Clearfield County have issued Declarations of Disaster Emergencies for Lawrence Township, Clearfield Borough, and Clearfield County due to severe weather and flooding.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

### **24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:**

#### **National Weather Service, 0400 hours, 07/28/16:**

Isolated showers and thunderstorms went across southern Pennsylvania overnight; otherwise, skies were mainly clear across the state. Early morning temperatures were in the mid to upper 60s across most of the area, but in the lower to mid 70s along the Maryland border.

Clouds will be on the increase today from south to north. Showers and thunderstorms will continue to develop across the southern part of the state as low pressure across the lower Ohio Valley early this morning tracks northeast toward Pennsylvania late today. High temperatures this afternoon will range from the upper 70s across the southwest, 80s across much of the area, to the lower 90s across the southeast.

Tonight will be a humid and wet night across the state. A soaking rain is expected across Pennsylvania later tonight and early Friday. Lows tonight will be mainly in the 60s across most of the region to the lower 70s across the southeast.

Widespread showers and thunderstorms will taper off from west to east by Friday afternoon, as a weak low pressure system tracks off The east coast. Most locations will have highs in the upper 70s to the mid 80s.

There will still be a chance of showers over the weekend as additional weak low pressure systems track eastward from the Central Great Plains.

A Flash Flood Watch is in effect until 1900, 7/29/16 in the following counties: Delaware, Chester, Montgomery, Bucks, and Philadelphia.
