**EMAC REQUEST/ PA IMT RESPONSE – Maryland, 7/31/16** – In response to an Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) request from the State of Maryland the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has sent a Type III Incident Management Team (IMT)

to Howard County, Maryland. The team is there to assist with logistics support for a flooding incident in Howard County which occurred due to adverse weather that passed through Maryland last week. Maryland requested the deployment of the PA IMT be extended until 8/14/16. Replacement personnel deployed on Friday August 6th and will stay until Sunday August 14th. Those who are demobilizing returned August 7th.

**MANDATORY WATER RESTRICTIONS – Cameron County, 8/2/16** – Driftwood Borough instituted voluntary water restrictions back in July due to lack of rain and low flow conditions at their Nanny Run Reservoir. As of August 2, the borough is under mandatory water restrictions. The borough has applied to DEP for an emergency permit to use a well at the filter treatment plant to sustain the water system as needed. It is unknown how long it will take to process the permit or if DEP will give approval to use this well.

**PHONE OUTAGE – Greene County, 8/9/16** – A county-wide phone outage occurred impacted Greene County. The main cable was cut into the central switch office so it could be moved for road construction. Originally Greene County was not advised of this outage but this was a scheduled outage for Windstream Communications. Phone service appears to have been service restored. The Greene County 911 will follow up with Windstream later today.

### **DISASTER DECLARATIONS:**

7/25/2016 – The Mayor of Dunmore Borough issued a Declaration of Disaster Emergency for the borough due to severe weather.

7/19/2016 – The U.S. Small Business Administration issued a SBA disaster declaration for Fayette, Greene, Somerset, Washington and Westmoreland counties for damages during the flooding event on June 17, 2016. The effective date is 7/19/16 and termination date for applications is 9/19/16. Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) application termination date is 4/19/17.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

An increasingly humid southeast flow will develop later today and continue into the mid-week period. After a sunny start to the day today, clouds will increase by this afternoon with a passing thunderstorm possible late in the day across Western Pennsylvania. The high temperature this afternoon will range from around 80 degrees across the Laurel Highlands to the upper 80s in Philadelphia and Erie.

A weak disturbance aloft will bring a round of numerous showers and thunderstorms across northern Pennsylvania overnight into early Wednesday, with additional showers and scattered thunderstorms in many locations Wednesday afternoon and evening.

Lows early Wednesday will be quite mild and in the mid 60s to lower 70s.

Heat and humidity will peak Thursday through Saturday, followed by the passage of a slow moving cold front Saturday night through Sunday night. The front will be accompanied by numerous showers and thunderstorms.
