COMMENTS:	<p>The Credentialing Team will provide SCTF Region LE Agencies with the capability to issue incident-specific Identification cards/credentials. The team will aid the Agency Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) by creating and issuing appropriate incident credentials for all personnel assisting with the incident. When conducive to operations, the team will also conduct personnel checks of those responding to the incident, if there is on-site electronic access for such checks.</p> <p>The Team will respond to suspected acts of terrorism, criminal mass casualty events or attempts of same, and will integrate with the command structure organized by the AHJ.</p> <p>The Team will also assist post incident through maintenance of records of all issued credentials, and will recover such credentials during demobilization.</p> <p>The Team should be able to assemble and respond within 2 hours and arrive within the area of operations within 4 hours. With appropriate relief periods, the Team should be prepared to be mobilized for up to 96 hours.</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Personal supplies refer to supplies to be able to self-sustain for 24 hours – hydration, food, personal care and clothing.</p> <p><b>Under all circumstances:</b> Communications must occur between the requesting agencies and providing agencies to discuss the scope of the assets requested.</p>

Comments:	<p>The Major Case Investigative Team will provide SCTF Region Law Enforcement Agencies with a cohesive criminal investigative response unit consisting of trained and experienced Criminal Investigators (CI) to aid the Agency Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) with the investigation of major criminal events that overwhelm the capabilities of the AHJ, including suspected acts of terrorism, criminal mass casualty events or attempts of same.</p> <p>The team will provide immediate criminal investigative assistance to the AHJ. The Team will integrate with the command structure organized by the AHJ, including criminal investigation of the incident by the AHJ.</p> <p>The Team will assist in a timely manner immediately following the incident, and will ensure investigative continuity, to turn the investigation over to the AHJ and/or appropriate state or federal LE authorities to continue the investigation.</p> <p>The Team should be able to assemble and respond within 2 hours and arrive within the area of operations within 4 hours. With appropriate relief periods, the Team should be prepared to be mobilized for up to 96 hours.</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Personal supplies refer to supplies to be able to self-sustain for 24 hours – hydration, food, personal care and clothing.</p> <p><b>Under all circumstances:</b> Communications must occur between the requesting agencies and providing agencies to discuss the scope of the assets requested.</p>
