- Thirty-six (36) months for project implementation

- Request limit \$150,000

-  Non-profit organizations- 501(c)(3) recognized
-  Located in Pennsylvania
-  Able to present a risk of a terrorist attack
 -  Prior threats or attacks (in/out U.S.)
 -  Symbolic value of the site, ideology or mission
 -  Vulnerability/risk assessment findings

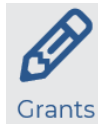
