What is the Purpose of NSGP?

Purpose

- Bipartisan supported grant funding to Protect and Secure facility/members/staff
- Encourage collaboration between the nonprofit community and the federal, state and local governments

Who is eligible?

- Non-profit organizations- 501(c)(3)as described under the IRS rules or exempt
- Project site-Pennsylvania
- Have a Unique Entity ID for the PA site-Award
- Able to present a risk of a Terrorist/Extremist attack
 - Prior threats or attacks (in/out U.S.)
 - Symbolic value of the site, ideology or mission
 - W Vulnerability/risk assessment findings



Examples of Eligible Nonprofits

- Not an Exhaustive list-501(c)(3)
 - Houses of Worship
 - **Educational Facilities**
 - Medical Facilities
 - Camps
 - Museums Museums
 - Senior Centers
 - Community and Social Service Organizations

Examples of Ineligible Nonprofits

What is eligible?

- Planning
 - Related to the protection of facility/members
 - Est. Security policies-Shelter in Place/COOP/Sharing info.-fusion
- Training/Exercise
 - Security-related training courses, programs and exercise
 - Active Shooter-Awareness-Emergency first aid-Cybersecurity-Bomb Threat
 - No travel backfill or OT
- Contracted Security
 - No Equipment/50% Waiver
 - Nonprofit must be able to sustain
- Management & Administration(M&A)
 - 5% maximum/Based on Actual Costs
- Equipment
 - Physical Security-Section 14
 - Inspection and Screening-Section 15
 - Information Technology-04
 - Cybersecurity-05
 - Interoperable Communication Equipment-06
 - Generators-10



What is NOT eligible?

- Organization costs, and operational overtime costs or operating expenses
- Hiring of public safety personnel
- General-use expenditures
- Overtime and backfill
- Initiatives that do not address the implementation of the NSGP program
- Development of risk/vulnerability assessments
- The development of risk/vulnerability assessment models
- Initiatives that fund risk or vulnerability security assessments or the development of the IJ
- Initiatives in which federal agencies are the beneficiary or that enhance federal property
- Initiatives which study technology development
- Proof-of-concept initiatives
- Initiatives that duplicate capabilities being provided by the Federal Government
- Reimbursement of pre-award security expenses
- Cameras for license plate readers/license plate reader software
- Cameras for facial recognition software
- Weapons or weapons-related training
- Knox boxes

- Reference Authorized Equipment List (AEL)
- Identify addressed Vulnerability
- Realistic Budget-add 10-15%
- Activities are not limited to equipment
 - Planning
 - Training/Exercise
 - M & A-if requested
 - Contracted Security



- Part V & VI Milestones & Project Management
 - Key events with logical progression
 - Covers the entire performance period
 - No dates outside of the performance period
 - Plan for EHP-90 days to 6 months
 - Effective implementation schedule
 - Confidence in project completion
 - Accountability

Tips from FEMA

- 1. When hiring grant writers, it is important to review their work for errors and make sure the IJ aligns with VA. The cost for grant writers is not allowable as it is pre-award.
- 2. Make sure IJ is complete and again that it aligns with the VA, do not request more than the max. allowed of \$150,000. IJ content should be logical, reasonable, and attainable.
- 3. Ensure all requested expenditures are allowable and align with VA. Any requests for unallowable items which are not on the AEL may result in your application being denied.
- 4. Threats/Risk Vulnerabilities: must tie threats/risk to existing physical vulnerabilities and terrorism or extremism
- 5. You must occupy the facility when you apply for this award. **NSGP does not fund projects for buildings under construction or renovation**.
- 6. You should not apply for projects simultaneously with a state NSGP program. If a nonprofit applies for and receives funds from two separate sources for the same project, that could be interpreted as supplanting or comingling of funds and the subrecipient could lose funding.

- Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)
 - Grant Application announcement
 - Dependent on Federal Appropriations Bill
- Deadline-Apr, May, June, 2024
- Anticipated Funding Dates
 - Funding Selection-August 2024
 - Award Date-September 30, 2024
