DISASTER DECLARATIONS:

8/17/16 – The Borough Council Members of Donora Borough issued a Declaration of Disaster for the borough, due to severe weather.

8/10/2016 – The Borough Council Members of Albion Borough issued a Declaration of Disaster Emergency for the borough, due to a drought/water emergency.

7/25/2016 – The Mayor of Dunmore Borough issued a Declaration of Disaster Emergency for the borough, due to severe weather.

7/19/2016 – The U.S. Small Business Administration issued a SBA disaster declaration for Fayette, Greene, Somerset, Washington and Westmoreland counties for damages during the flooding event on June 17, 2016. The effective date is 7/19/16 and termination date for applications is 9/19/16. Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) application termination date is 4/19/17.

3/23/16 - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to supplement commonwealth and local recovery efforts in the area affected by the severe winter storm which occurred January 22-23, 2016. The designation is FEMA-4267-DR.

24-hour Projected Weather Statewide:

National Weather Service, 0434 hours, 08/25/16:

A weak trough of low pressure will bring scattered showers to western Pennsylvania early today and the chance of a shower or thunderstorm to the eastern part of the state this afternoon. After a cloudy start to the day over much of the state, expect brightening skies by afternoon, especially over the central counties. It will be a warm and very humid day with highs this afternoon in the 80s.

A dying cold front will slide southeast from the Great Lakes this evening, bringing scattered showers and thunderstorms to northwest Pennsylvania. However, the chance of rain will diminish as the weakening front pushes through the rest of the state late tonight and early Friday. Lows tonight will be in the upper 60s to low 70s. On Friday, expect partly sunny skies to give way to mostly sunny skies during the afternoon as slightly drier air works in behind the weak cold front. Highs Friday will range from the low 80s over the northwest part of the Commonwealth to the low 90s across the southeast.
