The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) issued a Disaster Declaration (PA-00003) for a number of Pennsylvania counties impacted by flooding on April 11-12, 2024. The Disaster Recovery Assistance Program (DRAP) may be available to eligible residents help pay for losses that were a direct result of the disaster and live in a municipality identified in this notice.

DRAP is a grant program to aid recovery efforts for homeowners and renters who meet lower income thresholds, are uninsured or underinsured, and when other local, state, federal, non-governmental, or private aid is not available. For those who qualify, grants can be used to repair their home, cover temporary housing for household members and pets, or replace essential personal property.

## Eligibility

To be eligible for DRAP:

- 1. The homeowner or renter must have suffered losses caused directly by the disaster.
- 2. The homeowner's or renter's primary residence must be in a municipality included in this DRAP activation.
- 3. Household income must be below 500% of the most recent National Federal Poverty Guidelines published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- 4. Households *receiving income-based government assistance* may apply directly for a DRAP grant without first applying and being denied a disaster loan through SBA.
- 5. Households **not currently receiving** income-based government assistance, the applicant must first apply for a disaster loan through SBA and be denied because of inability to repay or inadequate credit to be eligible for a DRAP grant. (The SBA denial notification must be submitted with the DRAP application).
- 6. The homeowner's or renter's primary residence must be in a municipality included in this DRAP activation.

- Issued a disaster declaration within two weeks of the event.
- Reported damage to at least one home as a result of the disaster event.
